### SAMP GEC POLICIES

1. Students may apply courses to more than one category. (Example: English 367.02 is applied to the Second Writing and Literature requirement).
2. GEC requirements may overlap with program prerequisites and major requirements.
3. Drop a GEC Option.  
Students in SAMP may elect to drop (waive) one GEC requirement. The following categories are not eligible for the Drop a GEC.
  - Natural Sciences
  - Literature
  - Visual/Performing Arts
  - Any GEC course specifically required as a prerequisite for admission or program requirement
  - Any GEC course already completed to fulfill a GEC requirement (not retroactive)
  - Focus requirements. Western, non-U.S. (◆) or non-western /global (★) courses
4. Students with 15 or more credit hours of transfer credit (K) are not required to complete the Focus Requirements (Western, non-U.S. (◆) or non-western /global (★) courses).
