### SAMP GEC Policies

1. Students may double count the GEC Second Writing course with a course in another GEC category. These approved overlaps are indicated with a dagger (†).
2. Courses listed in the Historical Survey category which also appear outside of the Historical Survey category may only be applied to one GEC requirement.
3. GEC requirements may overlap with SAMP program prerequisites.
4. Drop a GEC Option. Students may elect to waive one GEC course. The following categories are not eligible for the Drop a GEC Option:
  - a. Natural Sciences
  - b. Literature
  - c. Visual/Performing Arts
  - d. Any GEC course specifically required as a prerequisite for admission to a SAMP major, or any program requirement
  - e. Any GEC course already completed to fulfill a GEC requirement (no retroactive option)
  - f. International Studies subcategory of Diversity requirement.
5. Students with 15 or more credit hours of transfer credit (K) credit are *not* required to complete the International Issues Diversity sub-requirement.

#### CATEGORY 2: Quantitative and Logical Skills

#### CATEGORY 3: Natural Sciences

##### 25 hours

One two-course sequence in either the biological or physical sciences and three additional science courses. At least one of the five courses must be from the biological sciences and one course from the physical sciences.

**CATEGORY 7: Diversity 0-15 hours**  
**Subcategories: Social Diversity & International Issues**

Two courses are required in the International Issues subcategory. These courses are indicated with diamonds (♦) and stars (★) and can be completed with a combination of two diamonds (♦♦), two (★★) stars, or a star (★) and a diamond (♦). A total of three courses must be completed to meet the Diversity category.

***Students should overlap the Diversity requirements with other GEC courses. If such an overlap is not planned, the diversity requirement must still be met.***
